TCMC President and Dean on HIGHER EDUCATION TODAY

Scranton, PA –Steven J. Scheinman, MD, President and Dean of The Commonwealth Medical College (TCMC) is currently appearing in an episode of HIGHER EDUCATION TODAY, a Washington, D.C.-based television talk show that connects viewers to contemporary issues, people, and institutions involved in the world of higher education. The show has won four Telly Awards.

HIGHER EDUCATION TODAY is produced by the University of the District of Columbia. The host is educational consultant and author Steven Roy Goodman. Each half-hour episode covers a new education subject. Mr. Goodman an international authority on college and graduate school admissions.

He described how TCMC's students train largely in outpatient settings and are required to perform 100 hours of community service, and pursue research projects in quality improvement and community health.
